After a busy summer session, we started accepting registrations for the new school year. At only two weeks into this process, we've already enrolled 900 youths. This number represents a recordbreaking pace and has created many resource challenges as we are seeing up to 500 members daily. The demand for our services appears higher than ever before. We are already serving more than 300 meals nightly, and every corner of our building is buzzing with activities.

While we will continue to offer many of our time-tested programs such as the New Balance Healthy Living Club or Academic Basketball this fall, we are very excited to roll out a new workforce development initiative aimed at middle and high school students. This project will provide career exploration, soft-skills training and paid internship positions, among many other offerings. The program's ultimate goal is to ensure that every member graduating from high school and the Club will have a plan to either go on to college, learn a trade or join the military. We are looking forward to the challenges.
